For Outstanding Achievements as an Educator, Mentor, and Role Model for Microwave Engineers and Engineering Students

Jenshan Lin is a Program Director at U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF) and a Professor Emeritus at University of Florida (UF). His career after Ph.D. in 1994 started at AT&T Bell Labs (industry), switched to UF in 2003 (academia), and then switched to NSF (government) in 2022. He graduated 29 Ph.D. students, hosted 32 visiting scholars, and supervised several M.S. and undergraduate students' research. He has published more than 300 papers, 2 books, 9 book chapters, and received 24 patents. Several of the patents by him and his students on vital-sign radar and wireless power have been licensed for commercialization.
